Bachelor of Business Administration

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) programme was introduced by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla in the University College of Business Studies with the objectives of training and management positions.

On the same pattern, we are offering the programme at your doorstep.

The duration of (BBA) is three years, spread over six semesters. There will be mid-term and end –term exams in each semesters. The total numbers of seats is 60. The distribution of seats is as under:

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Plus Two examinations under 10+2 system or examination equivalent thereto of a Board/ University established by Law in India with 45% marks (40% marks for Scheduled Caste/ Schedule Tribe candidates).

OR

Any examination of a University/ Board/ College or school in foreign country recognized as equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice-Chancellor/ equivalence committee of its own or on recommendations of association of Indian Universities with 45% marks (40% marks in case of SC/ST)

Age Limit

The maximum age limit for the course is 22 years on the 1st July of the year concerned, provided that in case of the candidates

belonging to **Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes**, the upper age limit will be relaxed by three years, provided further that the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reasons to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of three months.

Basis of Admission

Admission will be purely on the basis of the merit list as per the marks obtained in the 10+2 examination.

- Separate merit list shall be prepared for the subsidized category and NRI's/NRI-Sponsored/ Foreign National shall compete amongst their own category.
- 2. The college reserves the right to fill any vacant seat(s) in the self- financing category (i.e. NRI/NRI Sponsored/Foreign Nationals) on the basis of the academic performances of the candidates in the past examinations. Merit will be computed on the basis of Matric and 10+2 or the equivalent examinations having equal weight age, whereas candidates having Commerce or Mathematics as a subject at +2 level will be given the additional weight age of 10% of aggregate marks obtained by him/her in 10+2 or equivalent examination. Only eligible candidates depending upon the number of the seats shall be admitted to the programme.



Bachelor of Computer Application:

BCA is a three-year Degree Course spread in six semesters. There will be mid-term and end -term exams in each semesters. The total numbers of seats is 100. The distribution of seats is as under:

Eligibility for Admission to BCA:

Plus Two examinations under 10+2 system or examination equivalent thereto of a Board/ University established by Law in India with 40% marks (35% marks for Scheduled Caste/ Schedule Tribe candidates).

OR

Any examination of a University/ Board/ College or school in foreign country recognized as equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice-Chancellor/ equivalence committee of its own or on recommendations of association of Indian Universities with 40% marks (35% marks in case of SC/ST)

AGE LIMIT:

The maximum age limit for the course is 21 years for male candidates of **General Category**, 23 years for female candidates of General category and 24 years for both male and female candidates of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe category as on 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.



For Non- Subsidized Seats:

The candidates seeking admission under the payment of the non- subsidised category must submit his/her application on a plain paper with the Co-ordinator of BCA within three days after the display of the Merit list for the subsidized seats. In addition to the eligibility conditions mentioned above (under Scheme l). NRI's/NRI sponsored/Foreign nationals shall be required to submit along with the application form, any one of the following documents:

- a) Proof of Nationality in case of Foreign Nationals.
- b) Proof of their status in the case of NRI's.For this purpose, any of the following documents shall be considered as a proof
- c) Copy of Non-resident card/Employment card issued by the employer.
- d) Photocopy of the immigration card/ employment VISA entry on the passport along with the details of the passports
- e) Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy/High Commission is the country where NRI is residing.

f) Certificate of the sponsorship from NRI in the case of a sponsored candidate along with proof of NRI status of the sponsored requirement under Para (B)

g) Photocopy of the latest assessment order of the Income-Tax authorised in India and the Permanent Account Number (PAN) of the sponsored issued by the Income Tax Department.

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA):

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications is a one-year PG diploma course. PGDCA course can be pursued by the candidate after completion of basic undergraduate studies in any related stream. PGDCA course deals with the theory and practice of computer subjects.

The student will learn about topics including operating systems, database management systems, C, C++, computer architecture, Fundamental, system analysis and design over the PGDCA course. Candidates who successfully complete the programme will be qualified for a range of positions in the computer software industry.

Eligibility for Admission to PGDCA:

A Bachelor's Degree in any discipline with a minimum of 48 credits in Major subject, 48 credits in two minor subjects, 09 credits in compulsory, 01 credit GI & hobby with aggregate of 106 credits for the award of pass degree.

OR

A Bachelor's (Hons.) Degree in any discipline with a minimum of 56 credits in Major subject, 40 credits in two minor subject, 09 credits in compulsory, 01 credit GI & hobby and 14 credits in additional/compulsory/ skillbased and 03 credit in GI & hobby) with aggregate of 120 credits for the award of Honor's degree.

OR

At least 50% marks in aggregate (45% in case of SC/ST from a University established by law in India)

AGE LIMIT:

The maximum age limit for the course is 26 years for male candidates of **General Category**, 28 years for female candidates of General category and 29 years for both male and female candidates of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe category as on 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

For Non-Subsidised / Payment seats (BBA, BCA & PGDCA)

The final selection of BBA/BCA seats will be based on the merit of 10+2 in any stream and final selection of PGDCA seats will be based on merit of graduation basis in any stream, subjects to the permanent conditions laid by HPU

NOTE:

<u>The Parents must accompany with their</u> wards (students) at the time of admission

- 1. Only the eligible candidates shall be admitted to the courses subject to the availability of the seats.
- 2. The candidates shall compete in their respective category only.
- 3. Attendance in regular classes should be more than 75% of the total lectures delivered.
- 4. There will be a compulsory industrial tour for the students of 6^{th} semester of BBA.

<u>RESERVATION Rules (General)(HPU</u> Ordinance Volume II, Article 10.56-10.59)

Admission shall be subject to the following conditions:

- A. 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for SC and ST candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H. P Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh from any other Board like CBSE or ICSE, etc.
- **B.** The remaining **77.5%** seats shall be filled as under:
- i) 25% of seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination.
- ii) 75% of seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh from any other Board like CBSE or ICSE, etc. subject to the following reservations:

The Roster of admission showing reservations to the various categories shall be used as per the rules of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla

a.5% of the seats shall be reserved for the candidates outstanding in the cultural activities.

b 5% of seats shall be reserved for the outstanding sports persons.

c.3% of seats shall be reserved for Specially Abled candidates.

d. The relaxation of 5% in minimum education qualification to the candidates belonging to SC/ST categories of H.P.

During the summer (March to October), the dress code will be the same except coat & sweater. It will be mandatory for all the students of BCA to follow the dress code as per the above mentioned schedule and requirement. The students will be exempted from the above mentioned dress code on Wednesday & Saturday only. A student not following dress code will be penalized as per rules.

Eligibility for Promotion (BBA & BCA)

A candidate should have passed at least 50% papers of $1^{st} \& 2^{nd}$ semester for the admission to 3^{rd} semester of 2^{nd} year and 50% passed papers of $1^{st} \& 2^{nd}$ year shall determine the eligibility for the admission to 5^{th} semester of 3^{rd} year. Pass marks in each paper shall be 40%.

Note: Internal assessment will be given on the basis of the class test, surprise quiz

competitions, Presentations, class participation & attendance.



General Conduct/Discipline rules

All the students must note that ragging inside / outside the college campus is a cognizable offence. Any of the following activities will be considered a breach of discipline.

- a. Ragging in any form.
- b. Graffiti i.e. any sort of writing on the walls/ blackboard/ rooms etc.
- c. Damaging the college property in any manner.
- d. Loitering about the corridors and causing disturbance to the classes.
- e. Possession and use of drugs and indulgence in any other intoxicating substance in the campus.
- f. Inviting and Accompanying outsiders in the college.
- g. Sticking any kind of bills/ notices without the prior permission of the principal.
- h. Creating any kind of violence or nuisance in the campus.
- i. Attending College without I- Card.
- j. Use of mobile phones by the students in and around the classroom(s) and Exam Hall(s).

NOTE:

- Stringent action will be taken against the students found guilty of breaching conduct or discipline rules in the college, by the college administration.
- Defaulters including the students whose names have been struck – off from the roll (s) are not allowed to enter the college premises until exonerated or readmitted appropriately.

Attendance:

- i. At least 75% attendance in the lectures is compulsory for appearing in the university exams.
- ii. An irregular students or one who remains absent continuously for 7 days from the College / any elective subject, his her name will be struck off twice, he/ she will not be re- admitted to the college
- iii. A student is liable to pay all dues & fines as long as his/ her name remains in the college rolls.
- iv. The Principal reserves the right of expulsion/suspension of any student if the situation warrants so.

NOTE:

Students participating in inter- college competitions should note that the practice / rehearsal timing should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities do not substitute academics/ studies.

LIBRARY:-

Library is automated since 2010. The college library is automated using integrated library management system (ILMS) SOUL 2.0 software.

The library has good stock of different subject books & references books. The library subscribes 06 Newspapers & 15 Magazines.

Every student will be issued an Identity Card. Since "I-Card" is the only medium to identify/ differentiate a Bonafide college student from an outsider, every student must always carry it with him/her and must produce it whenever required (during all working days, examination(s) and college function(s) etc. Otherwise he/she will be considered an outsider and will be punished accordingly.

If I-Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy thereof is appended with such a request.

Rs. 50/-, are to be deposited for a duplicate Identity Card.

Examinations Eligibility/ Qualifying Conditions:-

1. To appear in University Examination, a student will have to fulfill 75% lecture condition (75% in theory and 75% in practical). The attendance will be counted from the first day of the commencement of the teaching work/ admission.

One Mid Term Test will be conducted in the month of August / September. A student will have to obtain at least 20% marks in each subject to become eligible for appearing in the university examinations.

Equal Opportunity Center

Equal Opportunity center is functional from the session under UGC Scheme to provide equal opportunity to women and students belonging to SC/ ST/ OBC (non- creamy Layer), minorities/ PD/BPL categories. Students of General Category can also avail this facility after paying the required tuition fees.

Parents – Teacher Association (PTA)

This association has been working actively and contributes regularly towards the improvement of the college infrastructure and provides assistance as per the requirement of the college.

Old Students' Association (OSA)

The college is proud of its Old Students Association (OSA) which is now the fountain head of its strength. OSA makes the prospective students feel the transformative touch after they join this prestigious institution of learning.

Educational Tours

Educational tours are arranged during the session every year:

- 1. Routes will be recommended by the concerned Committee of the educational tours and approved by principal.
- 2. Students will have to produce written permission from their parents for joining such tours.
- 3. The college will provide limited financial support as per permitted under rules.

Youth Festival: it is an inter –college activity organized by the HP university in four categories/groups-I, II, III & IV, Students having highly commended positions in the Youth Festival are given reservation in the PG Courses of HP University.

Inter- Faculty Cultural Function "Bodhi-Kala"

An inter-faculty cultural function is held for the students to represent their faculties for the running trophy in the various activities based on the format of HP University, Youth festival.



Club and Societies

The college has Cultural Activities Club, Environment Club, Eco-club and Subject Societies to celebrate the various notified days and event to educate the students throughout the year. **In addition to this** to inculcate the qualities of leadership, social service, discipline and patriotism among the youth, the following units are being run in college:

The interested student can get enrolled in the following units/clubs and reap the benefit of extra weightage of marks.

NSS, NCC, Rovers & Rangers and Red Ribbon Club

NSS

Presently the college has two NSS Units comprising of 100 students. 33% seats are reserved for the girls. Students who attend 240 hours of social service and attend "7 days" special camp are given the weightage of 2% marks at the time of admission in P.G Courses of H.P. University.



Rovers and Rangers is a worldwide association of well-disciplined volunteers. It has two wings, one for girls (Rangers) and one for the boys (Rovers) having 32 seats in each wing. Students, who obtain a **NIPUN** certificate, are eligible for 2% marks weight age while seeking employment in the railways and other government institutions.

Red Ribbon Club

The club aims at launching an exhaustive campaign against **AIDS**. It educates and sensitizes the college youth and general public about **AIDS**. Any college student can get registered with this club.



NCC

At present the college has one wings of NCC, one for boys and one for girls. There are 100 seats and 33% seats are reserved for girls. The students obtaining a 'C' CERTIFICATE in NCC are directly called for interview (without written test) and are given a weightage of 2% marks while seeking admission to HP University courses.



Career Guidance, Counseling and Placement Cell

The UGC formulated 'Career Guidance, Counseling and Placement Cell' has been constituted in the college with an aim to prepare the students for the job or selfreliance. The cell consists of a core committee and various faculty wise sub-committees which undertake the following activities from time to time.

- Sub-Committee organizes tutorials, competitions, and group-discussion. Interactive sessions etc. to raise the level of the inherent capabilities of the students.
- 2. In order to enhance the communication skills and soft skills of the student, the various activities make the students confident enough to face the interview/group discussions.
- 3. Students are given awareness about the prospectus of higher education in their future. They are also made aware of the job opportunities available in their stream/subject in the market/industry.

The cell provides the placement opportunities to the students by facilitating the various companies/private firms for organizing the placement drives/tests/interviews etc.



Pre-Admission Guidance & Counseling committee' provides pre-admission guidance to all the admission seekers particularly in the humanities. The committee provides their expert inputs regarding the choice of the subjects.

Tutorial Group

After the admission, every student is made a member of a specific tutorial group convened by a member of a specific tutorial group. As per the convenience of the students, every group organizes at least one or two meetings every month where the tutor give special attention to the students by imparting necessary guidance, increasing general awareness and addressing their academic as well as personal problems.

College Magazine, NALANDA

To nourish the creativity among the students, the college magazine "NALANDA" is published every year. It has many sections like Hindi, Sanskrit, Pahari, English, Science and Commerce, Management and Computer Science etc. One student-editor for each section is appointed in the beginning of the academic session.

Annual Prize Distribution Function

Annual Prize Distribution Function of the college is organized in the month of February/March every year. In this function prizes are given away to the students achieving distinctions at College/ University/ Inter-University Level, NSS, House exams, University exams, Sports, and other co-curricular activities.

ANTI- RAGGING/DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the educational institutions the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May 2001, 16th May 2007 and 11th Feb., 2009 has directed as hereunder:-

- 1. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the institution.
- 2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be Exemplary and justifiable harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - i. Imprisonment/fine or both.
 - ii. Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period and fine with a public apology.
 - iii. Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
 - iv. Debarring from representation in events.
 - v. Withholding of result.
 - vi. Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
- 4. In the hostels, the entry of seniors and outsiders shall be prohibited before and after Specified hours of the day expect under the authority of the person in charge (warden or hostel Superintendent).
- 5. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified collective punishment shall be resorted to.
- 6. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have and entry apart from that of general conduct and behavior to the effect whether the student had participated in particular was published for ragging.
- 7. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline if the past or if is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission shall be refused to him/her or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.
